

Finding an answer Part 1

Life decisions are serious.

First, in his booklet, *Successful decision-making*, Ken Lawson asks business people, “Have you given yourself ample time to do research? Are you sure you haven't bowed down to pressure to come to a swift decision?”

Lawson is, of course, talking about business decisions. But what about eternity? That's even more important.

Third, Lawson advises, “Put the problem into context . . . What would happen if you didn't do anything about it right now? Can you afford to wait?”

He sounds like an evangelist!
