

# How God cares

Can the God who created this vast universe be in any way interested in the small, insignificant details of our personal lives?

**First**, what could be more insignificant than the number of hairs on one's head? Yet Jesus said “the very hairs of your head are all numbered”! Matthew 10.30.

Perhaps God's greatness is seen as much in life's small things as in the magnificence and grandeur of his mighty Creation.
