

Got questions? Part 1

Here's a question some say has *no answer*. Can we really know whether or not there is a Creator God?

First, atheists say it's unprovable. Christians say the Creator's handiwork is obvious: “The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands.” Psalm 19.1 (NIV).

Second, we can't say that faith in God is only for the ignorant and simple-minded. The apostle Paul was a man of mighty intellect who at first vigorously opposed Christianity.

Third, we also have modern-day atheists who became Christians. Among them, Malcolm Muggeridge, university lecturer and then journalist and TV and radio broadcaster. And C. S. Lewis, Professor of Literature at Cambridge, an atheist for many years.

Also Lee Strobel, award-winning legal editor of the *Chicago Tribune* who has a Master of Studies in Law degree from Yale Law School. Now, as a believer, he investigates the toughest objections to Christianity in his Gold Medallion Book Award, *The case for faith*.

Fourth, in the Bible we are invited to accept that the following promise is from God himself: “Those who seek me diligently will find me.” Proverbs 8.17. It's a call for honest and serious searching.
