Neil Armstrong's carefully planned and costly journey to the moon was a daring experiment.

This first close encounter with Earth's nearest neighbour wasn't essential. He didn't need to take the risks that were involved in visiting our moon's hostile environment.

But compare an even longer journey – all the way from heaven – when God's Son came to Earth, “was made flesh and dwelt among us.” John 1.14. His visit – as the world's Saviour – was even more carefully planned: “promised before time began”! Titus 1.2.

And although, by comparison, many people see Jesus as nothing more than an ordinary man, he is in fact God's Son who brought us a first stunning picture of what God is like! He said, “He who has seen me has seen the Father.” John 14.9.
